FIGHTING TERRORISM

Every citizen, military or civilian, can have a positive effect in the ongoing war on terrorism. Kingsley Field is seeking to enhance that effort with the support of Klamath County citizens through the Eagle Eyes program.

The basis of the Eagle Eyes program is educating airmen and local population about patterns followed by terrorists while planning an attack and facilitating the reporting process. With such understanding citizens can play a vital role in detecting, deterring and preventing acts of terrorism and be among the most powerful weapons that protect our community.

Terrorists think globally but act locally and follow a general planning cycle. They begin by formulating a list of possible targets and gather information on them, primarily through surveillance and intercepted intelligence. Based on information they have gathered, they select a final target, taking into account target availability, impact and value.

During that planning cycle citizens might have an opportunity to disrupt the plan if they keep an Eagle Eye out and report suspicious behaviors such as surveillance, information elicitation, test of security measures, supply acquisition through theft or purchase of materials such as weapons, explosives and uniforms, suspicious people out of place, and rehearsals.

Everyone at Kingsley Field and in Klamath County is considered part of the antiterrorism team; as such you can report information 24 hours a day. Your information is immediately shared with appropriate law enforcement agencies and military commanders for action.

If you observe any suspicious activity **and is not an emergency**, anytime during the day or night, evade direct involvement, make note of it and call Kingsley Field's Base Defense Operations Center at 885-6663. Security Forces will react and notify law enforcement agencies and other agencies as needed.
