




# 173d Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program Reporting Fact Sheet




## Restricted Reporting Options (Confidential, No investigation)



\*\*\*Chaplain and Legal maintain a members confidentiality but they do not take reports\*\*\*

## Unrestricted Reporting Options (Confidential, Investigation initiated)





## Restricted Reporting

- Service members (SM), in any status, and military dependents 18 yrs and older
- Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC), Victim Advocate (VA), or healthcare personnel can take a restricted report of sexual assault (SA)
  - Chaplain and Legal can be consulted but these offices will not process the report further nor will the victim receive SAPR support/services
- Confidentiality maintained-victim has time/control over information release
- Does not initiate an investigation
- Can be converted to an Unrestricted Report at any time
- Friends/Family can maintain confidentiality of victim as long as they are not in SM's chain of command, Law Enforcement (Military or Civilian), or command staff
- Cannot file Restricted Report once an investigation has been initiated

Victim contacts Sexual Assault Response Coordinator, Victim Advocate (VA), or healthcare personnel to report sexual assault (SA)

SARC notifies Wing CC, TAG, NGB SAPR, SJA, First GO in Chain of Command, **within 24 hours** that a SA was reported. (Identifying information is **NOT** provided)

SARC offers and coordinates as applicable potential resources/healthcare  
\*\*\*includes SAFE (Sexual Assault Forensic Exam)\*\*\*  
SARC assigns VA based on victims preference

SARC and/or VA provide continual support as requested by SM

SARC will contact victim after a year to verify decision to keep report as Restricted if SAFE was completed. SARC will inform victim that SAFE will be destroyed 5 years from date of collection. No further contact is made unless initiated by victim





## Unrestricted Reporting

- Service members (SM), in any status, military dependents 18 yrs and older, and DoD Civilian Employees/Contractors and dependents 18 yrs and older
- Chain of Command, Law Enforcement (Military or Civilian), AFOSI, SARC, VA, or healthcare personnel
- Confidentiality limited
- Initiates an investigation and command notification
- Friends/Family can maintain confidentiality of SM as long as they are not in SM's chain of command, Law Enforcement (SFS and Civilian), or command staff

Victim makes report to Chain of Command, Law Enforcement (Military or Civilian), AFOSI, SARC, VA, or healthcare personnel (will be referred to SARC for report processing)

SARC notifies Wing CC, Unit CC, TAG, NGB SAPR, First GO in Chain of Command, SJA, and alleged offenders Unit/Wing CC **within 24 hours** that a SA was reported.

SARC offers and coordinates as applicable potential resources/healthcare  
\*\*\*includes SAFE (Sexual Assault Forensic Exam)\*\*\*

SARC assigns VA based on victims preference

SARC informs SM of Special Victims Counsel (SVC) eligibility

SM may request expedited unit transfer--unit has **72 hours** to process transfer

Investigation is conducted  
Victim may or may not participate in investigation

SARC and/or VA provide continual support as requested by victim
